In the process of realising this work, I have been able to process much of my trauma and get my life into a healthier space.

I haven't been able to do this alone, and I have a few people to thank...

To my partner Lyall, for your unwavering support and belief in me, and the care and love you show me every day. I still pinch myself that I get to share my life with you. Thank you for letting me be messy.

To everyone at Theatre Works, and in particular Dianne Toulson, whose unwavering support kept this play alive more times than she realises. None of us deserve you Di, but I'm so glad you're in our corner.

To our incredible team led by Justin for realising this story and bringing all of your heart, skill and experience to the work.

To my good friends Sharon, Megan and Rosa for always encouraging me and giving me strength. You are three of the strongest women I know.

My psychologist Faith, who has been instrumental in helping me process my trauma, find my voice and begin to turn my life around.

To my melancholy queen Lana Del Rey, whose music kept me going through some very tough moments in only the way great artists can.

And lastly, to my father Neville. Dad, I know we haven't always had the best relationship, but I know that whatever we have to face, we will face it together. Thank you for never giving up on me.

Adam Fawcett Playwright

Adam Fawcett is a queer playwright and screenwriter who lives and works on Djaara country in regional Victoria. With a practice focused on exploring queerness and trauma through text, their debut play, *Become The One*, won the 2018 Midsumma Queer Playwriting Award before premiering at the 2019 Midsumma Festival and going on to nationally in 2022, visiting over 16 regional and metro venues. *Become The One* was recently filmed as a 21-episode TikTok series through Matthewswood Productions, with Adam attached as screenwriter. Their third play, *Men on the Verge of a Nervous Breakdown*, is a 2024 Midsumma Queer Playwriting Award finalist, while their work of prose fiction, *Black Rainbow*, is a finalist in the 2024 Pearl Prize.

Justin Nott Director

Justin (all pronouns) is an independent theatremaker, writer and arts programmer with a Master of Theatre (Directing) from the Victorian College of the Arts for which he received the Orloff Family Charitable Trust Scholarship for excellence. Justin's work focuses on new writing, queer dramaturgies and formal experimentation, crafting highly visual works of ambitious scope. Justin most recently directed Angus Cameron's *For Love Nor Money* named by TimeOut as one of the best shows to see at Melbourne Fringe Festival 2023. Justin's directing credits also include *Variations or Exit Music* (2022), *Can't Be Tamed* (2018) and *Human_Error* (2017). He is the Artistic Director of queer arts festival Get Bent Fest! and performs with *Dazza & Keif* as alter-ego Gay Jordan. In 2024, Justin was the associate director for the Australian premiere of *The Inheritance* at fortyfive downstairs and will commence development on his new project, *Gay Shame*, with Darebin Speakeasy.

Lyall's professional theatre credits include *Midnight: The Cinderella Musical* (Aspect Entertainment), *North by Northwest* (Arts Centre Melbourne), *Savages* (fortyfivedownstairs), *Penelope* and *The Pride* (Red Stitch), *The Heretic* (MTC), *Sunday in the Park with George* (Victorian Opera), and *Merrily We Roll Along* (Watch This). 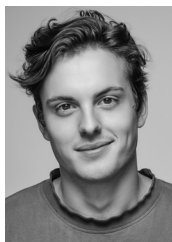


Megan Jones Jerica

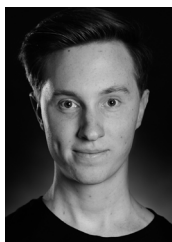

Since we began in 2012 we have presented over 270 performances to nearly 20,000 audiences in 106 venues across Australia and New Zealand.

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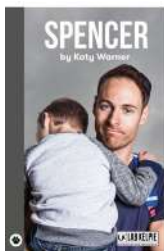
